His current appointment is Associate Professor of Medicine in Patras University, Rion, Patras, Greece and he is the head of the 3rd Division of Internal Medicine Department in Patras University Hospital.

Dr Starakis has a perennial educational work, both at undergraduate and postgraduate level. He has also participated in seminars to physicians and postgraduate programs in a number of regional hospitals. He also is a speaker at several local and nation-wide Medical Conferences and scientific events.

The research field of Dr. Starakis focuses on Internal Medicine and Infectious Diseases.
